Dear Friends,

We reproduce hereunder the text of our letter addressed to the Chairman, IBA and the Secretary, Department of Financial Service, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India, dated 11th March, 2013, for your information.

Quote :

Amendment to RBI Pension Regulations, 1990
with prior sanction of Govt. of India.

You are well aware of the fact that RBI with prior sanction of Government of India, has made amendments in Regulation 32 (Sub-Regulation 5) which reads as under :-

“The ordinary rate of family pension shall be thirty per cent of pay uniformly, subject to a minimum of Rupees three thousand five hundred only per month and a maximum of Rupees twenty four thousand four hundred ninety five only per month.”

Since the Pension Regulations in Banks is modeled on RBI Pension Regulations and Central Civil Rules, this was a natural expectation that similar such changes would be effected in Banks also. As no such instruction has come to the nationalised Banks so far, we make an earnest request to you to kindly look into the matter and take necessary steps so that same treatment is meted towards the Bank employees and officers.”
